

CITIZEN CHARTER

Animal Husbandry Department , Chandigarh Administration

Chandigarh, Union Territory has an area of around 114 Sq K.M.s with one fully-grown city Chandigarh and 17 Village Panchayats.

The livestock population in U.T Chandigarh is only 30845 besides 13954 dogs. The poultry population is about 1.52 Lacs.

Administrative set up :-

The Office of Animal Husbandry is located in Sector –22 (Behind Kiran Cinema) Chandigarh. The Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration is the Secretary of Animal Husbandry. The Joint Secretary Finance is the Director of Animal Husbandry. The Joint Director, Animal Husbandry, is supervising the fieldwork.

ANIMAL HEALTH AND VETERINARY SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE LIVESTOCK OWNERS.

The aim of the Animal Husbandry Department, Chandigarh Administration is to provide effective Veterinary services to the livestock / animals owners at easily approachable distances. The main Veterinary facilities being provided in the Veterinary Institutions are as under :-

- 1) Artificial Insemination of Cows & Buffaloes through Frozen Technique for improvement of breeds of Indigenous cows & buffaloes under cattle development programme.
- 2) Maintenance of Cattle health.
- 3) Prophylactic vaccinations against dreaded contagious diseases of cattle like Foot & Mouth, H.S and Rabies etc
- 4) Disease Diagnosis etc.

Apart from above vety aid facilities, N.G.-AWOs such as Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA), People for Animals (PFA) are also functioning in U.T Chandigarh for providing treatment to owner less injured / sick animals lying at public places. The S.P.C.A. has its own Hospital –cum-Rehabilitation Centre, at sector 38 Chandigarh. The PFA Chandigarh is functioning at # 1522, Sector-11D, Chandigarh and has its Hospital named as ‘Baser’ at village Khuda Lahora. An AWO named as CAWEDS is also functioning for the management of stray animals, The Chandigarh Administration provides financial assistance to these Organizations every year for their smooth functioning.

FUTURE PROGRAMMES

i) The existing Govt Veterinary Hospital, sector –38 Chandigarh has been proposed to be strengthened and expanded in regular poly clinic The facilities like disease diagnosis, bacteriological, etc. shall be provided to the livestock owners in the polyclinic.

FISHERIES DEPARTMENT
CHANDIGARH ADMINISTRATION

The Fisheries Department of Chandigarh Administration is being functioning as a separate wing of Animal Husbandry department.

Administrative set up: -

—

The supervisory work of this department is with the Joint Director, Animal Husbandry and Fisheries who works under the control of Director Fisheries. The Joint Secretary Finance has an additional charge of Director Fisheries. The additional charge of Secretary Fisheries is with the Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration.

A fish seed farm has been established down below the regulator on the extreme end of the lake. The main aim of the fish Seed farm is to produce quality fish seed for keeping its stock in Sukhna lake, forest check dams and village ponds. There are 15 rearing tanks and 12 nursery tanks and one stock tank covering an area of one hectare. The proposal has been to have one tube-well installed for providing fresh water to these ponds for producing quality seeds especially for production of ornamental fish. Accordingly, the tanks will be converted for breeding of ornamental fish.
