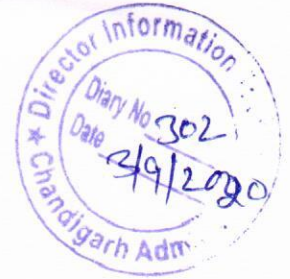

In pursuance of the broad mandate given by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its judgment dated 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2006 in WP (C) No. 310/1996 titled as "Prakash Singh & Others Versus Union of India & Others", the Administrator, Union Territory of Chandigarh is pleased to constitute a **Single Member Police Reforms Commission for Union Territory of Chandigarh** for recommending measures towards reforming the overall Police Structure and its functions in the Union Territory of Chandigarh.

2. The Police Reforms Commission shall consist of a single person of ability, integrity and standing and have adequate knowledge and experience of at least ten years relating to the functioning of Police Department and Administration.

3. The proposed terms of reference are as under :-


- (i) Measures to improve police infrastructure, upgrade police functioning i.e. Investigation, Prosecution, Forensic, Intelligence, Training, etc.
- (ii) To identify shortage of manpower, if any, and recommend necessary manpower required in terms of police-population ratio.
- (iii) Suggestions in recruitment system, training and skill enhancement techniques.
- (iv) Mechanism to deal public grievances in respect of Police Department.
- (v) To recommend upgradation of weaponry of Police Personnel and Police Mobility.
- (vi) Upgradation of Police Telecommunication Network.
- (vii) To recommend improvement of intelligence gathering techniques.
- (viii) Provision of police housing facilities and other welfare measures.
- (ix) Any other relevant recommendation, if any.

4. The Police Reforms Commission will submit its report within a period of three months from the date of Notification of its Constitution.

5. The Director General of Police, Union Territory, Chandigarh will provide the necessary Secretarial Assistance, Office, etc. to the Police Reforms Commission.

6. The Single Member Police Reforms Commission will be paid a Honorarium of Rupees One Lakh to be charged from the Police's sanctioned Budget.
