1. Introduction:

COVID-19 has been declared as a pandemic by WHO and after starting from Wuhan in China, it has spread fast to almost all countries globally. Total 203 samples of suspected covid persons of Chandigarh have been tested till 9th April, 2020 and 18 confirmed positive cases have been detected. It is comforting to note that there have been no confirmed case detected in last one week, rather 7 out of 18 positive cases have recovered and have been discharged from the health facilities and hence we have presently 11 active cases in Chandigarh with no death reported till date.

2. Scope:

At the outset, it is agreed that the expected spread of the infection of COVID-19 cannot be predicted due to uncertainties associated with the disease. However, if a contingency plan is to be made, the magnitude of the problems is to be defined to ascertain the arrangements to be made in health facilities which include beds, oxygen support, ventilator support, number of health care providers, logistics and food arrangements etc. Hence, some assessment regarding number of patients to be treated in various health facilities in the worst case scenario needs to be made.

Right from start of Janta Curfew on 22nd March, 2020, Chandigarh city has been under lockdown through imposition of curfew. Various other measures like door to door home delivery of essential items, compulsory

wearing of masks in public places, postponement of optional surgeries in government hospitals and other measures of social distancing etc. have been taken by the administration to break the chain to contain the transmission of infection. The number of cases indicates that these measures of social distancing have been able to create an impact of containing the spread till now. However, Chandigarh is surrounded by other major cities of Panchkula (Haryana) and Mohali (Punjab). Some hotspots have been observed in adjoining areas of Punjab and hence there is a danger of cross-border infection in Chandigarh. Hence, there is need to put in place a comprehensive mechanism and plan to manage the situation in worst case scenario.

It has been observed that many carriers of infection of COVID-19 do not show any symptoms of the disease and get cured due to self-immunity or many other reasons. Hence, there is a possibility that such persons may not be tested at all as per protocol of testing because they have no travel history for abroad, no history of being in contact with the confirmed positive case and do not show any symptoms. Hence, it is felt that about 1% population of Chandigarh may be tested as positive even in the worst case scenario for the city. Hence, about 12,000 confirmed cases of COVID-19 tests may be detected considering the current population of Chandigarh to be about 12 Lacs. All confirmed cases of COVID-19 have to be isolated in some health care facility to contain the further spread of infection to others as per standard protocol and these are to be discharged only after two

consecutive negative test reports spread over 24 hours. It is further expected that most of such confirmed cases will get cured in due course of time and peak day hospitalization of such active cases may be around 30% of the total confirmed positive cases. Hence, our estimate is that we need to be prepared for management of about 3600 active cases of COVID-19 on the worst day of the spread.

3. <u>Institutional framework:</u>

Health institutional framework is proposed as per the guidance document of Government of India on appropriate management of suspected/confirmed cases of COVID-19.

i) Fever Clinics:-

The guidance document emphasized the need that every hospital should set up fever clinic as first level of screening so that medical officers at such fever clinics may identify suspected cases and refer them to sampling centres for further assessment and sampling for COVID-19, if required. It has been decided to set up following such six fever clinics in the city:-

- GMSH-16
- GMCH-32
- PGIMER, Chandigarh
- Health Care Centre at Sector 22
- Health Care Centre, Sector 45
- Health Care Centre at Manimajra

ii) Sampling Centres:-

The guidance document suggest that all three types of facilities like COVID care centres for mild cases, dedicated health centre for moderate cases and COVID hospital for severe cases may have separate earmarked area for suspected and confirmed cases and sampling of suspected case is also to be done at such centres. We are likely to have around 15 such facilities spread over the city and hence sampling cannot be done at every such facility to economize the use of PPEs and trained health manpower. Further, the sampling facility needs to have isolation beds, preferably independent rooms, for about 12 hours period between taking of sample and receipt of testing report. It has also been suggested that ENT specialists and their interns need to be involved in the sampling process to ensure that correct nasal or throat swab sample is taken. Hence, the following three sampling facilities will function:-

As per established medical protocol preferably each tested person will be given the earmarked room during his stay in the hospital/sampling centre. Hence, in extreme cases, about 200 samples can be collected in

the upgraded bed facility in three hospitals even by following the protocol of providing the separate rooms. However, if the sampling is to increase beyond this then the number of persons in each room have to be increased and so it is decided to provide only one bed to one suspected person.

iii) Testing facility

Currently 2 VRDL labs, one each in PGIMER, Chandigarh and GMCH-32 are functional. Existing sampling capacity in two shifts of PGIMER and GMCH is about 300 and 190 samples per day respectively. PGIMER, Chandigarh is also catering to the adjoining areas of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and also for UT of Ladakh for testing the samples. Hence, PGIMER testing facility is partly available to Chandigarh. However, about 300 samples of Chandigarh can be tested in both these labs. The testing capacity per day in worst case may have to be ramped up. CSIR IMTECH Lab has reported full preparedness of its lab for testing alongwith availability of requisite machines and manpower. They are only waiting for the kits to be made available. Government of India would be requested to make the kits available to CSIR IMTECH Lab to take care of the additional testing required in worst case.

iv) COVID care centres:-

It has been estimated that about 75% of confirmed cases would either be asymptomatic or have mild symptoms. Hence we need to make

arrangements for about 2700 such positive patients on a peak day out of total 3600 positive and active patients on the peak day. The following is the list of COVID Care Centres which are to be used only for confirmed, asymptomatic or mild cases:-

Out of the above list, Parkview Hotel and James Hotel and private hospitals/Nursing Homes are to be provided on payment basis to those patients who can afford. The list above has order of priority i.e. initially
 Sood Dharamshala only would be used for mild confirmed cases and after it getting filled, we will move to next care centre i.e. Panchayat Bhawan so that optimum utilization of scarce, PPE and manpower is done.

- Every Covid Care Centre would be mapped to dedicated covid health centre and dedicated covid hospital for referral as per <u>Annexure 'A'</u>.
- Every care centre will have a dedicated ambulance for safe transport to higher facility, if the symptoms progress from mild to moderate or severe. Ambulances from private hospitals would be requisitioned by the Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh for each health care centre but stationed only when the concerned health care centre is made operational as per <u>Annexure 'E'</u>.
- Each covid care centre will have atleast one Ayush doctor and one allopathic doctor 24X7 in three shifts. They will also be supported by ward assistants, nurses and sanitary staff. The details of staff facility wise is as per <u>Annexure 'B'</u>.
- One Administrative Officer alongwith two other persons would be assigned to each covid centre to take care of other logistics and administrative issues in addition to medical staff deployed. List of such deployment at <u>Annexure 'C'</u>.
- Initially individual room would be assigned to each person but when the
 capacity starts getting exhausted, the sharing of rooms preferably by the
 members of the same family would be mandatory for optimum utilization
 of resources.

 Clinical criteria for mild patients would be as per guidance of Government of India i.e. confirmed cases with fever and/or upper respiratory tract illness [Influenza like illness (ILI)].

v) Dedicated Health Centre for moderate cases:

It is felt that about 25% of confirmed cases would have moderate or worse symptoms and actually need hospitalization. Out of these 25%, 15% patients may manage with moderate symptoms. However, we need to make arrangements for about 540 such positive patients with moderate but not severe symptoms out of total 3600 active cases on a peak day. The following facilities having total 500 beds in the order of priority would be earmarked as dedicated health centre:-

- Dedicated covid health centres would be the hospitals to offer care for all confirmed COVID-19 cases who are clinically assigned as moderate.
- Clinical criteria of Pneumonia with no signs of severe disease (Respiratory Rate 15 to 30/minute, SpO2 90%-94%) would be followed

for admission to such facilities.

 It will be manned by allopathic doctors of the concerned health institutions and cases will be monitored according to above mentioned clinical parameters for assessing severity as per treatment protocol.

These hospitals would have beds with assured oxygen support.

- The mapping of dedicated covid health centre to dedicated covid hospital is also as per <u>Annexure 'A'</u>.
- Each such hospital shall have dedicated basic life support ambulance with oxygen support for ensuring safe transport of a case to a dedicated covid hospital if the symptoms progress from moderate to severe.
- Each patient would be provided an independent room till the time capacity gets exhausted and then the rooms will have to be shared preferably with family members or otherwise to optimize the resources.
- On recovery if the patient turns negative, it would be endeavored to
 provide him an independent room till discharge on receipt of two
 consecutive negative test reports to minimize possibility of reinfection.

vi) Dedicated Covid Hospital:

It is estimated that remaining 10% patients of confirmed cases may develop severe symptoms and need utmost and specialized care. However, only few such patients may require ICU or ventilator support but provision of adequate number of ICU beds and ventilators is mandatory. So about 360 such severe patients need to be accommodated in dedicated covid hospitals on a peak day. The following hospitals in order of priority having total 400 beds would be earmarked as dedicated covid hospital:-

- Although present capacity of Nehru Hospital Extension building is 200
 beds yet many of its rooms have facility of additional bed for attendant.

 Dedicated covid hospital having confirmed cases is not supposed to have any attendant. So the attendant bed also can be used for patients and capacity of this dedicated covid hospital would be increased to 300 beds in emergency.
- Initially Nehru Hospital Extension Covid Hospital of PGIMER alone would be operated and the confirmed positive patients would be admitted to Sector 48 hospital after exhausting 90% capacity of Nehru Hospital Extension building.
- In peak scenario, these dedicated covid hospitals are supposed to be exclusively used for admitting only severe confirmed covid patients for comprehensive care. However, as per existing practice and directions, confirmed covid patients irrespective of their categorization as mild, moderate or severe would continue to be admitted in this dedicated covid hospital to optimize the resources. Subsequently, in emergency, the established protocol of admitting only severe cases would be followed.

- Both these dedicated covid hospitals shall be independent hospitals in separate blocks.
- Assignment of a case as severe would be done as per clinical criteria given in the guidance i.e. Severe Pneumonia (with respiratory rate ≥30/minute and/or SpO2 <90% in room air) or ARDS or Septic shock.
- Both these hospitals will have fully equipped ICUs, Ventilators and assured oxygen support. In case of emergency, additional ventilators would be shifted from the concerned institutions i.e. PGIMER and GMCH-32 to these dedicated covid hospitals from its other wards if more than earmarked ventilators are required. Ventilators in the private sector not being used in their respective hospitals can also be requisitioned by the Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh for support in these dedicated covid hospitals.

vii) Quarantine Centres:

In the peak scenario, the earlier identified quarantine centres are being proposed to be used as covid care centres for confirmed patients with mild symptoms. Although most of the persons coming in contact with the confirmed cases are proposed to be quarantined at their homes only yet there are certain densely populated colonies and quarantining of such persons in their small houses may not be desirable or feasible. Hence all such persons may need to be taken out of their colonies and housed in the

quarantine centres. There are community centres and government schools in almost all sectors of the city. Also there are covered stadiums in some sectors. Such schools, community centres and stadiums are proposed to be used as quarantine centres. Lodging and food arrangement for these centres would be looked after by the Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh in consultation with Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh.

4. Logistic Support:

i) Laundry:-

Laundry service will be provided as per requirement and as on actual need basis and not on daily basis to minimize the contact of staff with the confirmed cases in case of all three levels of health care facilities. However, the responsibility for this purpose will be as per **Annexure 'D'**. Hotel Shivalik View would be responsible for picking the dirty laundry and transporting the fresh laundry to the facilities assigned to it.

ii) Food:-

Hygienic and basic meals would be provided to the patients. The responsibility for which is as per <u>Annexure 'D'</u>. The organizations assigned the responsibility to provide packed food would also be responsible for transporting the food to the faculty.

iii) Disposal of medical waste:-

The leftover food alongwith disposable plates and other medical waste in all the health care facilities for covid would be done by the agency Alliance Envocare Pvt. Ltd. hired by the health authorities and disposed of as per relevant rules. Daily collection of medical waste from operational facilities would be the responsibility of Alliance Envocare Pvt. Ltd.

iv) Medical Equipments:-

Medical equipments like gloves, masks, sanitizers, PPE as per requirement, Gum-boots, disinfectants etc will be provided to the staff deployed at all these facilities. The responsibility for providing these materials would be as per **Annexure 'D'**.

Apart from the medical equipments, other provisions like bed mattresses, bed sheets, towels, sugar cubes, tea bags, milk powder, tooth brush, tooth paste etc. as may be required in temporarily created health care facilities will be taken care of by the Deputy Commissioner-cum-Chairman, Red Cross, Chandigarh through Nodal Officer.

v) Budget:

Expenditure to create above facilities, where there is no specific provision for the same, may be done from the funds allocated to Disaster Management Plan by the Deputy Commissioner, Chandigarh.

vi) Overall Incharge

The responsibility for ensuring that all logistical support is extended to all three levels of health care facilities and quarantine centres would be of Sh. Uma Shankar Gupta, PCS. He would be assisted by Sh. Rakesh Popli, PCS in this endeavour.

The purpose of this document is to detail out an objective mechanism to classify the estimated active cases in different kind of health facilities to be provided for asymptomatic and mild, moderate and severe cases of COVID-19; and also to put in place a standard protocol so as to ensure best utilization of scarce resources of human as well as medical equipment and still take appropriate care of active cases. This document is an attempt to prepare for the worst but with a hope that the need to operationalize it may not arise.
