The highlights of 'Greening Chandigarh Action Plan' of 2011-12 are

- 1. Planting of **2,30,897 saplings** by various Departments over places like Sukhna catchment, Wildlife Sanctuary, Reserved forests, unutilized land, barren land, Roads, Parks, Green belts, Community land, Government offices, Residential Complexes, Markets etc.
- 2. Free distribution of 20,000 saplings of trees, shrubs & herbs by Forest Department through its six Nurseries to Educational Institutions, Medical Institutions, Resident Welfare Associations, Non-Government Organisations etc. to be planted on public/private lands.
- 3. Distribution/selling of 20,000 saplings of ornamental, flowering and fruit trees/shrubs by Horticulture Wings of Municipal Corporation and Engineering Department to institutions and individuals for planting on public/private land.
- 4. Seed sowing of 3.0 lakh patches on the hill tops and steep slopes of Sukhna Wild Life Sanctuary.
- 5. Planting of 1.0 lakh stem cuttings of Arundo-donax along choe banks to stabilize choe-banks against soil erosion in the catchment area of Sukhna Lake.
- 6. Massive Plantation Drive will be organized in the Schools, Colleges, Residential Colonies, Villages, Hospitals and other public and private lands as a part of 'Van Mahotsava' celebrations during the month of July-August, 2011.
- 7. Group planting of flowering trees at the entry points of Chandigarh and other vintage points of major roads, Reserve forests, Parks, gardens, green belts etc. This will not only provide a boost to the aesthetics of the area but also break the monotony of greenery. Flowering trees will be in bloom at different periods throughout the year.
- 8. Planting of hardy, shade giving, long living and pollution abating species in the locations identified for having more pollution, particularly the roads.



- 9. More emphasis on planting of indigenous fruit trees like Neem, Mango, Peepal, Jamun etc. to increase avian population.
- 10. Replenishing and conserving the biodiversity of nature spots like Leisure Valley, Reserve forests, Sukhna Wildlife Sanctuary and Sukhna Lake by removing obnoxious weeds and planting/introduction of indigenous palatable species.
- 11. Establishment of Herbal Gardens in Schools, Colleges and other Institutions.
- 12. Ensuring tall planting [3' to 5' tall **saplings**] for better survival.
- 13. Post planting care by ensuring proper protection and regular watering.
- 14. Selection of dwarf species to be planted under the electric lines and telephone lines.
- 15. Removal of Lantana, parthenium and cuscuta from the city and forest areas.
- 16. Protection of existing trees and replacement of dead, dying and diseased trees.
- 17. Control of pests like Mango mealy bug & stem borer on regular basis.
- 18. Charging ground water aquifer by minimizing surface run off.
- 19. Treatment of the termite infested trees as per the expert advice of the scientists of the Forests Research Institute, Dehradun.
- 20. Awareness generation programmes will be organized to sensitize the masses for protection and conservation of flora and fauna.
